Art and Design	Digital photography and editing: Composition, lighting, nature, close-up, still life, portrait. Editing skills using Snapseed app. Art History: Photography, Pop Art.	Art history homeworks graded according to YETs. Art History: Core knowledge tests. Summative mark at the end of project.
Computing	Data representation: binary-denary conversion, character coding, encryption, bitmap graphics, game making.	
Design and Technology	Option Choices Taster Mini Projects: Across the year, pupils spend 6 weeks in each specialism to help them make their GCSE choice.	Pupils are assessed in their knowledge and evaluation, design, planning & making.
Drama	Physical theatre, including the work of the Frantic Assembly. Epic Theatre development and consolidation, including a streamed performance and reflection.	Half-termly tasks.
English	Pupils study a unit on the <i>Moving Image</i> looking at how directorial choices/ creative decisions are similar to those of an author. Pupils then apply their understanding of directorial choices to their study of Shakespeare's <i>The Tempest</i> , examining how the text has been transformed from script to stage and screen.	Pupils will complete a reading assessment (analysis) of <i>Hugo</i> . Both the formative & summative task will feed into it. A creative project.

Mathematics	Number: Rounding, estimation and bounds; Algebra: Solving equations and inequalities; Geometry: Surface Area and Volume of shapes; Data Handling: Averages from grouped and/or ungrouped data	End of term test in the penultimate week of term.
