WELCOME!

Welcome to the first edition of our new-look News@Com! This year we will be sharing news and updates more frequently from CVC in our refreshed newsletter, which will be published each fortnight. Our aim is to give you a flavour of what has been happening in school and to share some of the many trips and

activities that have taken place. You will see that we have also included a list of upcoming events, which we hope will serve as a useful reminder each fortnight.

It certainly has been a busy first fortnight back, and I have enjoyed meeting many of your children (largely in the queue for the Buttery!). They have settled well into school life at the start of a new academic year, into new routines and new classes. Our new year 7 children have settled in exceptionally well, and we are delighted to once again have welcomed a very large cohort into the sixth form from CVC and across the Cambridgeshire area.

This year a core priority will be building on the excellent outcomes achieved by pupils in year 11 and 13 in 2025, and identifying particular groups of pupils who are at risk of underachievement. We will also continue work that began last year on redeveloping the curriculum, to ensure that it is engaging and relevant, and best meets the needs of our pupils. To support these priorities, teachers at CVC now have a fortnightly subject professional development session as part of the school day, which is designed to provide more time for collaborative planning, the moderation of work, and to support staff in developing subject-specific knowledge and pedagogy.

I look forward to meeting many of you at the various events happening in school this term, including our 'meet the SLG' events that are happening in the next two weeks. If you have not yet signed up, the deadline to do so is Sunday, and you can use this <u>link</u>.

Year 11 results


We are really proud of our pupils' achievements n their GCSE results this summer.

Our pupils continued to perform well against the national picture and our results continue to be extremely stable from last year. This particular Year 11 cohort transitioned to us during the COVID pandemic and so their success showed the hard work that they put into their studies, alongside the support of parents, carers and staff.

As we reflect on our practice and look towards the future, we have a slightly different approach to interventions with our pupils (beginning in KS3 and continuing into KS4) with planned time for staff to support learning beyond the classroom.

We were also delighted to welcome record numbers of Year 11 CVC pupils back into the sixth form, where they have made a fantastic start!





Sixth Form results

The A level and L3 BTEC results were yet again excellent for Comberton Sixth Form, and we were incredibly proud of our students and their outstanding achievements in their summer exams. Their hard work and commitment to their studies led to some truly impressive outcomes, with 92% of our students securing places at their chosen universities and an impressive 45% progressing to Oxbridge or Russell Group institutions. It was a truly exceptional year for university destinations!

As we begin the new academic year, we are delighted to welcome our largest ever cohort of Sixth Form students to Comberton who have joined us from over 25 different local, national and international colleges. It has been a pleasure to see their positive energy, ambition, and enthusiasm as they settle into their new courses and routines following two fantastic Induction Days, where they got to spend time with the sixth form team and their tutors.

CURRICULUM IMMERSION DAYS

On Monday, 20th and Tuesday, 21st October all pupils in years 7 to 11 will undertake activities which are different to their normal timetable. These days are a wonderful chance to study different areas of the curriculum in greater depth and pupils gain a huge amount from them.

All pupils must continue to wear full school uniform, unless informed by an individual department, for example, pupils will wear their PE kit for PE.

The overall programme will be as follows:

Year 7: On one of the days, pupils will try alternative sports with the PE department and on the other day will carry out environmental based activities.

Year 8: On one of the days, pupils will visit Walton-On-The-Naze to complete their Geography fieldwork. On the other, they will do a variety of language and cultural activities.

Year 9: Pupils will undertake a variety of cross-curricular environmental work.

Year 10: Pupils will follow a programme of core RPE, personal development and careers activities.

Year 11: Those pupils studying arts/technology courses will do their practical assessments. All other pupils will undertake work with subject specialists to prepare for their mock exams, core computing activities and CPR training.
