## WELCOME!

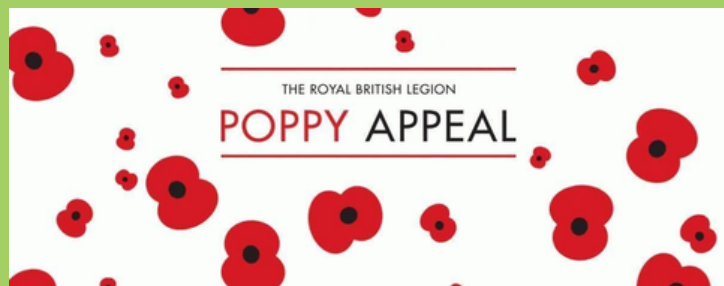
I can't quite believe that we have reached the end of term! The last eight weeks have flown by, and it has been a great joy to join the CVC community.

# ROSS WELFORD- LIBRARY & ENGLISH MAGICAL AUTHOR VISIT

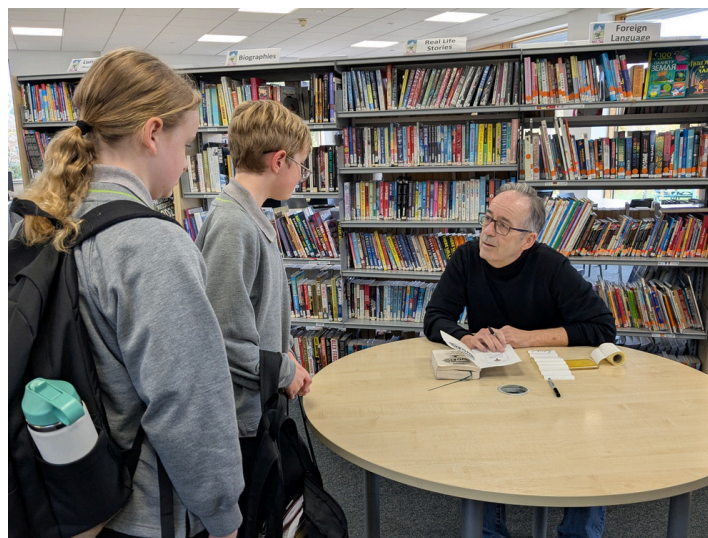
This October, the Library and the English department hosted children's author (and member of the Magic Circle) Ross Welford to talk to Year 7 about writing. The Library (with generous support from the Friends of Comberton Village College) gave all our new pupils a gift of their own Ross Welford book during their transition visit to Comberton in July. This was then followed up by English lessons focusing on story openings inspired by his writing at the start of this term.

Ross's novels explore magic in the everyday and numerous bizarre situations (such as time travelling with a hamster and characters who live to 1000!). He discussed the importance of the imagination and reading, whilst performing intriguing, mind-blowing tricks. Though he gave excellent tips on writing, he sadly did not reveal his magic secrets! It was fantastic to see students so enthused about Ross's novels and their reading.

Some students also took part in a creative writing workshop about story openings. All the pieces they wrote showcased the pupils' creativity and confidence, but congratulations to the top three writers who excelled with the structure and imagery in their writing: Oona McKenzie, Sam Wallwork and Edward Underwood. 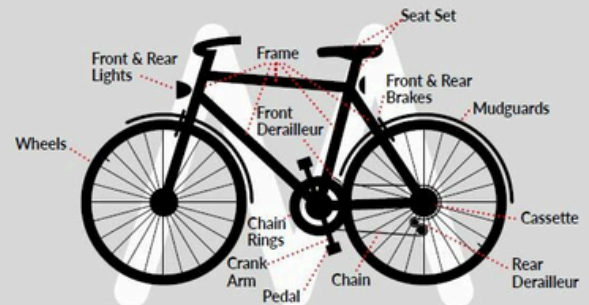

### ABC CHECK

#### A - AIR

Make sure your tyres are inflated (your tyre should say the minimum and maximum pressure)

#### C - CHAIN -

Make sure it is running smoothly and lubricated - add a few drops of bike lube and give it a good clean every three weeks

## South Cambridgeshire MP Pippa Heylings visits Comberton Sixth Form

Students and staff at Comberton Sixth Form were pleased to welcome Pippa Heylings, MP for South Cambridgeshire, for a visit that sparked thoughtful discussion on the current challenges and future of education.

During her time at the Sixth Form, Pippa met with senior staff and education leaders to explore key issues facing schools and colleges today. Topics included funding for SEND, the complexities of EHCP applications, and concerns surrounding access to funded transport for students in rural areas.

Conversations also touched on the pressing need for greater support in safeguarding and online safety across education settings.

Pippa was particularly interested in the Sixth Form's new sustainability initiative, currently being trialled as part of the Year 12 Enrichment Programme. Staff and students shared how the project is fostering environmental awareness and encouraging positive change within the school community.

Another key topic raised during the visit was the voting age, with discussions around how best to educate 16- and 17-year-olds about democratic participation, the responsibilities of voting, and making informed choices at the ballot box. Pippa expressed strong support for engaging young people early in the political process and was looking forward to working collaboratively with the Sixth Form in the future on this.



A highlight of the visit was a student panel, where sixth formers asked insightful questions on a range of topics, from the future of education to online misogyny and the core values of the Liberal Democrats. The conversation reflected students' growing awareness of social and political issues, and Pippa responded candidly, encouraging open dialogue and critical thinking.

The visit concluded with a tour of the Sixth Form site and a drop-in to a Year 12 Politics class, where she spoke briefly about her journey into politics, her experience as a female MP, and her hopes for the future of political engagement among young people.

It was an inspiring and informative morning, offering students a real-world insight into politics and policy—and reminding all involved of the importance of student voice in shaping the future.
