

# **Child-on-Child Abuse Survey**

We continue to work hard to tackle the issue of Child-on-Child Abuse at Comberton Village College and create safer corridors for our pupils. We have conducted another pupil survey and we are able to share some of the results with you.

We saw an increase in the number of pupils participating in the survey, with a total of 848 responses.

Since the last survey in 2021, the results show a reduction in the number of pupils experiencing unwanted sexualised behaviour, across all year groups. We know this is still something that is happening in school, and appreciate there is still work to be done, but this is encouraging.

We are also pleased to report that 89% of pupils know how to report unwanted sexualised behaviour and with more awareness this will only increase.

However, the survey suggests some pupils still see sexualised attitudes, language, and behaviour as Banter. We will continue to raise awareness and educate on this important matter.

We held a pupil focus group in February, where we displayed the Child-on-Child Abuse posters that pupils had been asked to design earlier in the year. The pupils that attended were able to select the posters which they felt were visually appealing and gave a clear message about Child-on-Child Abuse. We are working with the art department to adapt these ready for display in school to raise awareness and encourage pupils to report.

## **Keeping Safe Online**

The Internet Watch Foundation (IWF) have shared that their research suggests that online Sexual Imagery of Children is one of the biggest issues impacting our young people today. The IWF have highlighted girls aged 11-13 year are most at risk.
