THE POISONING NOW INVOLVES 3 PRESIDENTS!



After a week of waiting, complaining and refusals, the investigation continues with the new addition Donald Trump. His spokeswoman accused Russia of undermining the security of countries worldwide.

Meanwhile, Foreign Secretary Boris Johnson said the attack was Russia's "way of saying to people, this is what happens to people who face our rule".

On the 4th March, Sergei Skripal and his daughter got poisoned by Novichok, a strong nerve agent made in Russia, as an attempted murder in Salisbury. This has caused Theresa May to blame Vladimir Putin for their deaths.

When the BBC interviewed him, he rudely told them to leave him alone and come back when it was all over.

On 1 November 2006, Alexander Litvinenko fell ill and was hospitalised. He died three weeks later, becoming the first confirmed victim of lethal polonium-210. There were accusations that Russian president Vladimir Putin was behind his death, which resulted in worldwide media coverage. The poisonings may be linked, but it is unconfirmed that any accusations are rightful.
